To be clear though, it is not just church growth that I'm interested in; I'm interested in your growth as well. I want to support you as you take the next step in your walk of faith. I want to encourage you as you struggle and celebrate with you when the Christ brings deep joy into your life. I'm glad I'm going to be around for a while to do that. So let's get to know one another over the next months. I believe our time together will be fruitful, impactful and fun!

There is work to be done as we move forward together these next three years. It takes courage to take up the challenge and serve God in fresh ways. I have no doubt Rockville is up to the task if, and only if, it's all hands on deck!
